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MAPPING OF SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP INITIATIVES

The project partners collected 40 social entrepreneurship initiatives from Austria, Cyprus, Greece and Slovenia.

NEEDS IDENTIFICATION

We conducted a survey to assess training needs with regard to social entrepreneurship. 116 people with disabilities, 85 trainers or adult educators and 20 organisations took part in the survey – many thanks to you all!

The survey results show that 19% of people with disabilities are interested in becoming an entrepreneur. Trainers think that courses in social entrepreneurship will help their clients to acquire learning additional skills (82%), social inclusion (74 %) and integration into the labour market (65%). Besides carrying out the survey, the partners conducted desk research on the situation in each country with regard to national strategies and policies about people with disabilities and social entrepreneurship.

FRAMEWORK DEVELOPMENT

As part of the survey, participants were asked to self-evaluate their entrepreneurial, digital and financial skills. Based on these responses, the partnership will develop a competence framework that forms the basis for the development of training materials for our social entrepreneurship courses.
